

## TERMS of the FELLOWSHIP

The Fellowship is open to all Technion Architecture students. The Fellowship will be announced every year at the beginning of Spring semester. The announcement poster will be created by the previous year Fellow at the Technion and approved by the sponsor of the Fellowship.

Proposals will be presented to the Dean and /or Professor in charge of the Fellowship and a board consisting of the Professor, the Dean, one faculty member (chosen by the Professor and/or sponsor) and the sponsor (or his representative). In the event that the sponsor will not attend the meeting, the board will choose the best five (5) proposals among all others, and send a CD with the proposals to the sponsor to review.

One student will be chosen on the basis of their proposal, a recommendation letter from a faculty member familiar with their work, drawing and communication skills, and a portfolio.

All materials must be in English.

The student must present a proposal in writing (min. 5 A4 pages, max. 10 A4 pages) explaining their suggested project / work plan for the Fellowship, including a travel schedule and proposed budget. The proposal must be based on a min. 10 day travel throughout Greece. The project must include sketching, writing, photographing, meeting professionals and/or other students and/or locals, visiting buildings, places, institutions, learning, living, inspired from Greece, learning from Greek reality and in relationship and compared to the reality in Israel. The students must present their proposal and supporting material in a CD format using Powerpoint, Acrobat, or Word formats only. Presentation files should be larger than 5 MB.

All materials must be in English.

The Fellowship student will exhibit his/her work in the Technion building no later than the second month of the following academic year, and reproduce his/her work in a CD (using Powerpoint, Acrobat, or Word formats only) a copy of which will be delivered to the sponsor of the Fellowship.

The Fellowship includes a stipend of 350 euro, and a roundtrip ticket to Greece from Israel.

It is important to construct the trip in such a way, so that the stipend covers all expenses or the balance will be covered by the student. For example, it is possible to make arrangements to stay at monasteries / hostels / be a guest to local families, etc. The student must investigate the possibilities of traveling to Greece on a fixed budget, making the most out of the given resources.
